an Francisco held the city's annual Fleet Week celebration during 3/11 October with the arrival of a small fleet on Friday the 7th, followed by an airshow that was reduced due to fog that never quite left the bay. Saturday's show was cut

short due to the fog, and Sunday was a complete fog-out.

The ship parade was led by San Francisco Fire Department's St. Francis fire boat #3. The lead ship was the USS Princeton (CG-59), a Ticonderoga-class guided missile

cruiser. Next up was the USS Harpers Ferry (LSD-49), which is the first of four new cargo variants of the Whidbey Island-class of dock landing ships. The futuristic-looking USS Kansas (LCS-22) was behind LSD-49 and is an Independence-class littoral
