Good morning, Beirut! New Jersey fires a salvo from her 16-inchers at Syrian-controlled targets while off the coast of Lebanon. On 23 October 1983, terrorist suicide bombers rammed trucks into barracks trucks into barracks
occupied by peacekeepers.
Some 240 US Marines, 58
French paratroopers, and
a New Jersey sailor were
killed. However, there was
no clear target to attack.
Staying on station much
longer than intended (she
was the only operational
battleship at that point),
she was finally allowed to
retaliate on 14 December
1983 — the first time her
16-inchers were fired in
anger since Vietnam. Her
shells landed 16 to 18 miles
inside Syrian-controlled
areas of Lebanon.
